Haiti. Two Centuries of Artistic Creation.

During a series of special events, L'Artocarpe's artistic director, Regine Cuzin, will discuss her most recent exhibition at the Grand Palais in Paris.

Regine Cuzin

Artistic director of L'Artocarpe, independent curator and contemporary art advisor, Regine Cuzin is an expert in contemporary Caribbean, African and over-seas art. During her career she has discovered and supported nearly a hundred artists of diverse nationalities in order to showcase and promote their works in artistic institutions, both in France and around the world. Through the catalogues and publications associated with her exhibitions, her work has influenced subsequent generations of curators and art professionals, and her dynamic and current approach has a real influence on the contemporary art market. Central to this approach, Regine Cuzin has always invested time and care in order to understand the artist's creative process, often visiting sites of creation across the world, including artists workshops, residencies and art schools. Her aim is to follow the course of promising artists over a period of several years, in order to encourage exposure in instances when they may otherwise be neglected.

Her latest exhibition at the Grand Palais in Paris, entitled 'Haiti', is currently open between November 9th 2014 and the 15th of February 2015. This important exhibition showcases over 100 works by Haitian artists from the 19th Century to today, and takes a rhizomic approach to contemporary Haitian art, also including examples from the United States, Finland, Germany and France. The exhibition intends to subject both major and unpublished works to a discourse which challenges traditional stereotypes often associated with Haitian art, particularly in association with the voodoo, artistic naivety and the 'Saint-Soleil'. Contemporary works (some of which have been created especially for the exhibition) are brought into dialogue with older pieces through a series of sub-topics: spirits, chiefs, untitled, landscape, and artists in conversation.

From her base in Paris, Regine Cuzin has been the Artistic Director of L'Artocarpe since January 2014, and has been deeply invested in her role from the very beginning. In one year we have already seen concrete results from her direction, and in refining the focus of L'Artocarpe, her appointment lends the organisation a new credibility in professional contexts and with established artists who wish to join the platform.

2015 has got off to a great start for L'Artocarpe. With the help of Regine Cuzin, the Guadeloupian artist Henri Tauliaut (based in Martinique) was chosen by the selection committee of Havana Biennale (Cuba) to represent Guadeloupe in the next edition, which will take place in May of this year. Meanwhile another L'Artocarpe member, Samuel Gelas, is currently in residence in Paris at the Cite Internationale des Arts, thanks again to Regine Cuzin.

During her time in Guadeloupe in January 2015, Regine Cuzin will be meeting with various official partners, students and the public in order to discuss her work in contemporary art. Her schedule includes:
